RESIDENT SUBMISSION

Bird Haven, Bird Heaven

At the Patio Homes, housing extends beyond the eleven duplexes that are devoted to us humans. There are also four bird houses around Bella Vista Circle (BVC) that are open for occupancy on a no lease, nocharge basis! Three of these that have a rustic design were constructed and deployed by Milo Richmond of 115 BVC, who fashioned both the houses and the posts they are mounted on. The fourth is of commercial design (including the post), set up by Dixie Merilahti and Dominick Paolillo at 113 BVC, who wanted a bird house they could see from their side window.

Three of the four houses use rain gardens for their setting, and therefore are close to human dwellings. The fourth is remote from the living units, in the wilderness spaces on the northwest side of BVC, near the entrance to the Circle. The birdhouses that were successful in attracting residents this year are the ones close to our living units.



This year the birdhouse in the garden

between units 117 and 119 attracted bluebirds. The two at the garden between 113 and 115 housed wrens, beginning at the westfacing location It seems that the principal occupant moved to her "summer quarters" at the east-facing location to raise a second brood!

Now that the breeding season is over, the birdhouses close to our dwellings are cleaned



and inspected in preparation for their reuse next year. We are looking forward to seeing the birdhouses in full use in years to come. But why have we had no luck with the house in the wilderness area? Could it be that our birds **want** to be close to our dwellings? Curiously this seems to be the case. The bushes around the dwellings have been popular as nesting areas for robins. And at 115 BVC, Milo and Bonnie have a wreath on their front door. A robin built a nest attached to that wreath (lower photo),

creating a composite image we could never contrive on our own.



So there is reciprocity required to extend our relationship with the birds into the future. They will take advantage of the houses we supply for their use, in their preferred locations. Its up to us to see to it that their houses are clean and ready at the beginning of the breeding season.

The birdhouses that Milo built are part of a bygone group effort to cater to the birds here at Longview. So, Milo made the effort to tour all the birdhouses fabricated or upgraded during that project, while also checking for indications of other bird nesting sites along the way. The result is a mixture of good and bad news.

He quickly spotted six nesting sites near the main building, including a wren's nest near the entry to the Garden Level. Also, the bird feeding efforts from the third and fourth floors seem to be successful. However, the birdhouses on the tour were largely occupied by ants and not used by our birds. The takehome lesson seems to be that we need to reconvene a group of residents who share an interest in catering to our birds, to make suggestions on how to promote better use of the birdhouses. Location may be important. Considering the results at the Patio Homes, the birds do not mind being close to us, and houses at the sites close to us are the ones most likely to receive the required routine care.


The Open Art Studio begins **September 3** and will go from **10:15 AM** – **11:15 AM**
